Prevention of Sexual Harassment (POSH) of Women & Internal Compliance Committee

Forms of Harassment

- Verbal - sex based comments, inappropriate description of person, initiating sex based rumors etc.
- Physical - inappropriate touching, patting, pinching etc.
- Visual - sexual/ provocative gestures, leering, ogling etc.
- Written - provocative writing/ sketching
- Cyber - unwanted repeated calls, invitation, sending of pornographic messages/ materials etc.

The College has a Code of Conduct that Informs Students

1. Not to abuse others by word, writing or action.
2. Not to give or receive phone numbers or other e-contact identities to unknown people.
3. Not to share somebody else's contact information to anyone unless it is required in formal contexts.
4. Not to gossip or spread rumors.

SHe-Box (Sexual Harassment Complaint Box)

A physical SHe-Box is placed on campus to enable women students, faculty, and staff to confidentially report incidents of sexual harassment. Complaints—signed or anonymous—can be dropped into the box and will be reviewed by the Internal Compliance Committee as per the Sexual Harassment of Women at Workplace (Prevention, Prohibition and Redressal) Act, 2013.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- During working hours, students are not allowed to leave the classroom or enter without the permission of the teacher.
- Students should avoid loitering on the verandas and college campus, during working hours.
- Students are expected to read the notices put up on the boards regularly. Failing to do so and claiming that he/she does not know about the information posted on the college notice board is not excused at any cost.
- Students should dress modestly and decently while coming to college. The dress code for students is to be strictly followed. T-shirts, short tops, and tight-fitting dresses are not allowed.
- Mobile phones are strictly prohibited. If found with students, the mobile phone will be confiscated.
- The cleanliness of the college building, furniture, and surroundings would be the personal responsibility of every student. Help us to keep walls, furniture, floor, and premises be kept clean.
- No student of the college shall be a member of any association or club not connected with the college; without the prior permission of the Principal, nor can they take part in any anti-social activities of any kind.
- As per the education rules laid down by the government, the Principal has full power to impose a fine / suspension / expulsion from the college as part of the disciplinary action.
- Students should not wear jewelry or other valuable materials. The college is not responsible for loss of mobile phones/jewelry of the students during working hours.

Attendance

- The college insists on a mandatory minimum attendance of at least 75%, to qualify to appear for University examinations.
- Leave letters to be produced to the class-in-charge on the date of reporting to college, for the period of absence.
- All leave letters should be countersigned by the parent or guardian in the case of day-scholars and by the Warden of the Hostels in the case of hostellers.
- Students should not absent themselves from the internal assessment or any tests conducted in the college.
- Submission of the assignments and conduct of seminars is mandatory for internal assessment.
- In case of medical leave, students have to inform their HoD orally and produce their medical & fitness certificates for period of absence on the date of reporting to college.

Library Rules

- A strict silence policy is enforced in the library to maintain an atmosphere conducive to study.
- Please handle the library reading materials with the utmost care. Mutilation, writing, scribbling, marking, and cutting pages qualify for a penalty.
- Users are requested to bring their ID cards issued by the institution while visiting the library. The ID card is a must for borrowing library books and is not transferable. Books are issued for a period of seven days and overdue returns will attract a fine.

- All members are requested to keep their personal belongings at the property counter at their own risk. The library is not responsible for any loss or damage.
- Use of personal stereos, music sets, and mobile phones are not permitted inside the library.
- Taking food items, drinks and other unwanted things to the library is not allowed, and if anyone is found not following these rules, they will be severely punished.
- The library is fully automated using modern library management software, enabling easy access through an Online Public Access Catalogue (OPAC).
- Faculty members can borrow 04 books, non-teaching staff members can borrow 02 books, and UG students are eligible to borrow 03 books. The books should be returned by the due date.
- Reference books, journals, and periodicals and e-resources are available to the library users for referencing inside the library only.
- The borrowers are requested to check the books and other reading materials thoroughly for any missing pages, chapters, damages, markings, etc. before borrowing.
- Borrowers' books in damaged condition will not be accepted by the library. If any book is found mutilated and spoiled, the borrower must replace it.
- Borrowing privileges may be restricted or suspended in the event of misbehaviour or misuse of library facilities or materials.
- The institute smart ID card used for borrowing library materials is not transferable, and it must be produced whenever requested by library staff.

- Borrowers are responsible for all items issued in their name until they return them to the library.
- Faculty and staff members who are going on long leave, with or without salary, deputation, study leave, or extraordinary leave, will have to return all borrowed materials before leaving the institute.
- No material from the library should be taken out without proper issuance or recording. Any type of violation leads to disciplinary action.
- The library offers photocopying facility at a reasonable rate.

SACAS Book Bank Scheme

- The SACAS Book Bank Scheme is fully funded by the Management. It was started on 15th July, 2022. The scheme has been implemented to endow a collection of undergraduate level textbooks to the meritorious, needy and underprivileged students.
- The library issues a circular in the beginning of every semester which includes the necessary information and application link to avail the benefit as per the library rules. It is also available on our college website.
- Eligible students are advised to make use of the opportunity wisely.
